

# BRIGHTON PRIMARY SCHOOL CRICKET REGISTRATION FORM – 2019



## PLEASE NOTE: Registration forms are due back asap. By Monday, 4th February at the latest.

Both boys and girls from years 2-7 are welcome to play cricket for our school. Each team requires a minimum of 7 players and the season is split over term's 1 and 4 (i.e. the same team, with the same coach and manager, plays in the same grade in both term 1 <u>and</u> in term 4). The following grades are available for players:-

- **KANGA** is a modified game of cricket for year 2 and 3 children (plastic balls, bats and wickets). There are KANGA JUNIOR (year 2) and KANGA SENIOR (year 3) divisions, both played on Saturday morning at the Marion oval (off Sturt Rd behind the Marion sports complex). KANGA JUNIOR starts at 8:30 a.m. and KANGA SENIOR at 9:30a.m. (Kanga games tend to finish within an hour).
- All girls (Year's 2-7):- If numbers allow this. Kanga Girls will be offered Yrs 2-5, and all girls grade team for Yr 5-7.
- **C GRADE** (Year's 4-5):- Is played on Thursday evenings 4 6pm at various schools in the area.
- B GRADE (Year's 5-6):- Is played Saturday mornings 8:30 till approx. 10.30am at various local schools.
- A GRADE (Year's 6-7):- Is played Saturday mornings 8:30 till approx. 11.30am at various local schools.

Uniform is grade specific (but all players must wear a broad brimmed hat);

Kanga:- School uniform (black shorts and yellow shirt)
 C and B Grades:- Must wear a white shirt but can wear all white.

A Grade:- Must wear cricket whites

#### **Coaches and Managers**

Unfortunately, if we don't get a manager and coach for each team, we <u>cannot</u> enter them in the competition. I will be seeking volunteers to fill these roles. You can indicate your willingness to coach a team on the Registration Form. Please note that you do not need special skills or expertise to coach as the children need to be taught the rudiments of cricket, fielding placements, batting and bowling techniques. Children rotate through all positions so they get a feel for the different roles and can develop their skill and identify strengths and weaknesses. Parental support for team organisation, scoring and transport to matches is <u>absolutely essential</u>.

#### **Fees and Registration Form**

Fees are set at \$50 for A – C grades, and \$35 for Kanga for the full season (i.e. payment is for both term 1 and term 4). You will be invoiced for this and required to make payment within 2 weeks of the invoice date (or contact Lisa in Finance to set up a payment plan).

# **Next Steps and First Game**

Once the registration forms are received, I will organise the teams, coaches and managers and provide updates via email. This means I desperately need volunteers for coach and managers. The games are commencing a week earlier than previous years, so time is tight and a training session before the first game may be unlikely given the turnaround timeframe:

## Codes of Behaviour

- \* Behave in a manner that respects the rights of others regardless of mediums of communication used, eg. Verbal and non verbal communication, digital mediums such as twitter, Facebook, email and texts

#### FOR TEACHERS, COACHES & TEAM MANAGERS:

- \* Set a good example for your players.
- \* Encourage and create opportunities.
- \* Teach a wide range of team skills.
- \* Ensure that the sport is appropriate for the age group and the skill development level of the players involved
- \* Teach your players to be friendly towards officials and opponents.
- \* Give all interested students a chance to participate in training and in games.
- \* Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behaviour is not acceptable.
- \* Keep your own knowledge of coaching and the developments of the game up to date.

# FOR PARENTS:

- \* Encourage participation by your children.
- \* Provide a model of good sporting spirit for your child to copy.
- \* Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
- \* Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty.
- \* Make any new parents feel welcome on all occasions.
- \* Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.

### FOR SPECTATORS:

- \* Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour.
- \* Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment.
- \* Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- \* Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- \* Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters

Any perceived breach of the Code of Behaviour will follow the grievance policy available for your reference on the School Sports Policy.

Please liaise with your team coach or manager, and if not resolved, escalate to your sport's coordinator, the sports liaison coordinator, or to the Sports Committee Chairperson.
