

BRIGHTON PRIMARY SCHOOL TEEBALL 2019

Please note: Registration Forms due back ASAP – Friday, 8th February 2019 at the latest

Tee ball starts on Saturday, 16th of February, and once again will be offered in terms 1 & 4.



We look forward to welcoming new players and their families and welcoming back our players and families who have previously played.

Tee ball is the one extracurricular sport that Brighton Primary offers our students from Reception through to Year 5. In the past we have found most of our players are in the junior primary teams as it is such a convenient and gentle introduction to team sports. Teeball is fantastic way for our children to develop ball-game skills, team work and have fun. It allows our children to learn and practice the skills of batting, catching, running the bases, and throwing. Please note: For the 'red division', junior primary teams' players cannot 'get out', it's all about giving it a go and having some fun. It's a relaxed environment.

Each team requires a minimum of 7 players and the season is split over term's 1 and 4 (i.e. the same team, with the same coach, plays in the same grade in both term 1 <u>and</u> in term 4).

Location: Games are held at the one location each week, making it easy on parents and carers to plan ahead. Glenelg Baseball Club, Anderson Reserve, Anderson Avenue Glenelg North SA 5045.

<u>Game times:</u> Receptions – Yr 2 (Junior Primary) = Red Division: Play at 9am - finish by 10am. Year 3 and up = Divisions: Silver, Gold: Play at 10am – finish by 11am.

<u>Come and Try</u> If you're unsure if your child would like to give tee ball a go – we are offering a 'come and try' + information session on Saturday, 2 February from 9.15 – 10.15am. This will be held at our school oval.

<u>Uniform</u> Is a yellow extra curriculum top or yellow polo or t-shirt and black shorts or skirt & sneakers. Hats to be worn.

During games, players can wear a Brighton baseball cap which is available through myself for \$16.50. Place your order directly with me to ensure I have stock. Payment can be made by cash/card to Lisa in Finance, or on Qkr! After payment has been received I will organise the hat's delivery.

<u>Training</u> is at the discretion of our coaches and volunteers so we will decide if we will offer training once we have commitment from our coaches. Should training sessions be offered, they are optional to attend. Parents/Carers must be in attendance of the child for the entire training session. If training does not occur we will have a short 15min practice before each game starts. We encourage as much involvement as possible (especially with the junior primary teams) so please join in.

<u>Coaches</u> As extra curricular sports are run on the kindness of our school community volunteering their time and energy, we are unable to enter a team into competition without a coach. We require one coach per team (approx. 5 coaches).

FOR TEACHERS, COACHES & TEAM MANAGERS:

- * Set a good example for your players.
- * Encourage and create opportunities.
- * Teach a wide range of team skills.
- * Ensure that the sport is appropriate for the age group and the skill development level of the players involved
- * Teach your players to be friendly towards officials and opponents.
- * Give all interested students a chance to participate in training and in games.
- * Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behaviour is not acceptable.
- * Keep your own knowledge of coaching and the developments of the game up to date.

FOR PARENTS:

- * Encourage participation by your children.
- * Provide a model of good sporting spirit for your child to copy.
- * Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
- * Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty.
- * Make any new parents feel welcome on all occasions.
- * Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.

FOR SPECTATORS:

- * Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour.
- * Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment.
- * Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- * Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- * Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters

Any perceived breach of the Code of Behaviour will follow the grievance policy available for your reference on the School Sports Policy.

Please liaise with your team coach or manager, and if not resolved, escalate to your sport's coordinator, the sports liaison coordinator, or to the Sports Committee Chairperson.
