

BRIGHTON PRIMARY SCHOOL NETBALL 2019



Good Afternoon! Your child has indicated they would like to know more about school netball. Please have a read through and contact me should you have any further queries.

Who can play? Both girls and boys are welcome to play netball for Brighton Primary School. There is a maximum of 2 boy players per team. Girls and boys can play from year 3 to year 7. Teams are mainly generated on school year levels.

Season Duration: Games commence in term 2 and run through most of term 3. There is a break of 3-4 weeks that bookend the winter school holidays. Last season was made of 12 games from mid-May to early Sept.

Game day and training:

- ♦ Years 3 & 4 matches are played on a Thursday afternoon at 4.00pm. 4 x 10 min quarters.
- ♦ Years 5, 6 and 7 games are scheduled at 4.00pm on Wednesday's. 4 x 12 min quarters.

Training days and times depend on your coach's availability.

Game location: Matches are a mix of locations, scheduled both home at Brighton Primary, and away, at other schools (e.g. SPW, Warradale, Seacliff, Clovelly Park, Glenelg, Paringa Park, Seaview Downs, Sunrise, St Leonards)

Fees: \$65.00 per player payable to Brighton Primary School. Please wait until you are invoiced before paying.

Children who submit late registrations will only be included in a team if a vacancy exists. In the case of more children registering for a sport than positions available, or if there are limited coaches, children will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. To save disappointment, quickly return the registration form via the class office box or deliver directly to the front office.

Uniform: Extra-curricular top, black shorts, or black skirt with black sports briefs, & sneakers. No jewellery to be worn including earrings. Finger nails need to be short.

Coaches and Team Managers: Brighton Primary School extra-curricular sports are run on the kindness and dedication of volunteers. Each team requires a coach (this can be shared between 2 people if preferred) and a team manager. Without these 2 positions filled for each team we will not be able to register the team. It is not the responsibility of the school to provide a coach or manager.

For the safety of all our children, Brighton Primary School requires all coaches and team managers to have completed 4 volunteer components. A Volunteer pack is available from the school or through the sports coordinator.

Coaching entails teaching the players how to play the game, teamwork, positions on court, and conducting practice. Team Manager is responsible for communications and duty of care. No experience is necessary for either position, many of us learn as we go!

FOR TEACHERS, COACHES & TEAM MANAGERS:

- * Set a good example for your players.
- * Encourage and create opportunities.
- * Teach a wide range of team skills.
- * Ensure that the sport is appropriate for the age group and the skill development level of the players involved
- * Teach your players to be friendly towards officials and opponents.
- * Give all interested students a chance to participate in training and in games.
- * Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behaviour is not acceptable.
- * Keep your own knowledge of coaching and the developments of the game up to date.

FOR PARENTS:

- * Encourage participation by your children.
- * Provide a model of good sporting spirit for your child to copy.
- * Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
- * Encourage honest effort, skilled performance and team loyalty.
- * Make any new parents feel welcome on all occasions.
- * Do not interfere with the conduct of any events.

FOR SPECTATORS:

- * Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour.
- * Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment.
- * Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- * Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- * Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters

Any perceived breach of the Code of Behaviour will follow the grievance policy available for your reference on the School Sports Policy.

Please liaise with your team coach or manager, and if not resolved, escalate to your sport's coordinator, the sports liaison coordinator, or to the Sports Committee Chairperson.
