Late Registrations: Children who submit late registrations will only be included in a team if a vacancy exists. Where there are too many children registering for a sport and limited coaches, children will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Season dates	9 May to 29 August 2020 Approximately 12 games in fixture (including Byes) + Lightening Carnival on 9 May 3-week break over winter holidays
Game details	Yr 2-3: 4 x 10-minute quarters. Contact: No tackle, bump, smother, steals or contact. Yr 4-5: 4 x 12-minute quarters. Contact: Modified tackle, no bump, steals, push or smother. Yr 6-7: 4 x 15-minute quarters Contact: Tackling permitted as per Aust football laws.
Team Size	Yr 2-3: 9 a side (3 zones) Maximum Squad 12. Yr 4-5: 15 a side Maximum Squad 18. Yr 6-7: 15-18 a side. Maximum Squad 22.
Team Composition	Teams can be mixed, boys & girls.
Game days	Saturday
Game time	Yr 2-3: 08.30am Yr 4-5: 9.30am Yr 6/7: 10.30am
Game venue	Our school oval and at other local schools. Home and Away fixture
Training days	At the discretion and availability of the coach. May be before games.
Equipment	All game equipment provided by the school
Uniform	Yellow and Black Football Guernsey on loan from school. Black shorts. Gold black hooped socks available through uniform shop or stores. Footy boots.
Fees	\$70 per player
Adult Support	A team will not be registered unless it has a Coach and Team Manager

Coaches and Team Managers: Brighton Primary School extra-curricular sports are run on the kindness and dedication of volunteers. Each team requires a coach (this can be shared between 2 people if preferred) and a team manager. Without these 2 positions filled for each team we will not register the team.

Coaching entails teaching the players how to play the game, teamwork, positions on court, and conducting practice if able. The coach is to bring the first aid kit & resources to the games & practice and take register of team attendance.

Team Manager is responsible for communications of game details, captains, scorer and support the coach. The team manager needs to take a team photo.

No experience is necessary for either position, many of us learn as we go!

Coaches and Team Managers are required to complete the Department for Education Volunteer Application process.
