



CRICKET MASTERBLASTER SUMMER (TERM 1 AND 4) 2022

Please register on Qkr! by Monday, 7th February 2022 at the latest

The summer season is split over term's 1 and 4 (i.e. the same team, with the same coach and manager, plays in the same grade in both term 1 and term 4). Your child must be prepared to play both terms 1 and 4. Should your child wish to withdraw; no refund will be provided.

Late Registrations: Children who submit late registrations will only be included in a team if a vacancy exists. Where there are too many children registering for a sport and limited coaches, children will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

Years Available to play	Year 2 – Junior. Year 3 – Senior.
Season dates	Saturday, 19 th February to Saturday 2 nd April. Excludes 14 th March - long weekend. Term 4 dates to be advised.
Game details	Games are played for 1hr and 15 minutes.
Team Size	Minimum 6 players, Maximum 8 players
Team Composition	Teams are mixed – boys and girls
Game days	Saturday morning's.
Game time	Master Blaster Junior 08:30-09:45am. Master Blaster Senior 09:45-11:00am
Game Venue	Marion Oval. 247 Sturt Road, Sturt.
Training days	At the discretion of the coach, if able.
Equipment	Game equipment set up and provided by SACA
Uniform	Black shorts or skort. Yellow school polo top. School hat or cap. (Top available at the uniform shop, cap cannot be worn at school)
Fees	\$50 total. \$20 registration fee to be paid to the school. \$30 to be paid directly to SACA via a registration link which will be emailed once we have submitted the team registration. Registration is via the Qkr app, no payment is required to register. Full payment is required by the invoiced due date given by BPS* and the SACA (*unless a payment plan has been established). Failure to pay by the due date will result in removal from the team.
Adult Support	A team will not be registered unless it has a Coach and Team Manager.

Coaches and Team Managers: Brighton Primary School extra-curricular sports are run on the kindness and dedication of volunteers. **Coaches and Team Managers are required to complete the Department for Education (DfE) Volunteer Application process, please refer to the blog for more details.**

Coaching entails teaching the players how to play the game, teamwork, positions on field, and conducting practice (if able). The coach is to bring the first aid kit to the games. The coach is responsible to take record of player attendance at training and games.

Team Manager is responsible for communications of game details, captains, scorer and venue. The team manager needs to take a team photo, and keep record of who is allocated which singlet, plus support the coach. No experience is necessary for either position, many of us learn as we go!
